Who's Who in Church History

- T. David Gordon (1954-): American evangelical scholar and author of *Why Johnny Can't Preach*.
- Alexander Bruce (1831-1899): Scottish theologian & apologist.
- Dr. Martyn Lloyd-Jones (1899-1981): Highly-regarded medical doctor who left medicine to preach. Was famous for preaching through books of the Bible verse-by-verse.
- Joel Osteen (1963-): Leading proponent of the heretical Prosperity and Word-of-Faith theologies who nevertheless is considered "America's Pastor."
- Martin Luther (1483-1546): German monk who started the Protestant Reformation. A fierce defender of salvation by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone.
